


BEADING CEREMONY

What is WoodBadge?

Baden Powell, the founder of Scouting, began Wood Badge training in 1919 as a way to ensure the leaders of Scout troops were properly trained. Since then, Wood Badge has been held world-

wide, providing advanced leadership training to thousands of Scout leaders. Wood Badge builds upon the best traditions and experiences of the Boy Scouts of America and also draws from a wide range of courses within and beyond the bounds of Scouting to present leadership theory and team development all taught in the setting of the



Scouting experience. Once a Wood Badge candidate completes the full 5 day course along with their 5 ticket items within 18 months, they are recognized at a *Beading Ceremony*.

What is taught in this course?

Scouters acquire valuable tools such as listening, communicating, conflict management, project planning, and leading change and internalize the five themes of Wood Badge, all in the



fun learning environment of Scouting! Participants in the course will better learn to understand and appreciate diversity and differences in our society. They will learn skills that will make them better Scout leaders. Units with trained leaders are able to deliver an improved program and a more meaningful experience for the youth Scouting serves.

Who should attend?

The course will benefit all Troop and Pack leaders. In addition any adult that wants to increase their skills will greatly benefit from Wood Badge training.

NYLT for Youth

As Wood Badge is for adults, National Youth Leader Training (NYLT) is designed for scouts. NYLT teaches many of the same concepts as Wood Badge, but geared towards scouts starting at age 14. It is highly recommended for scouts to take NYLT.
